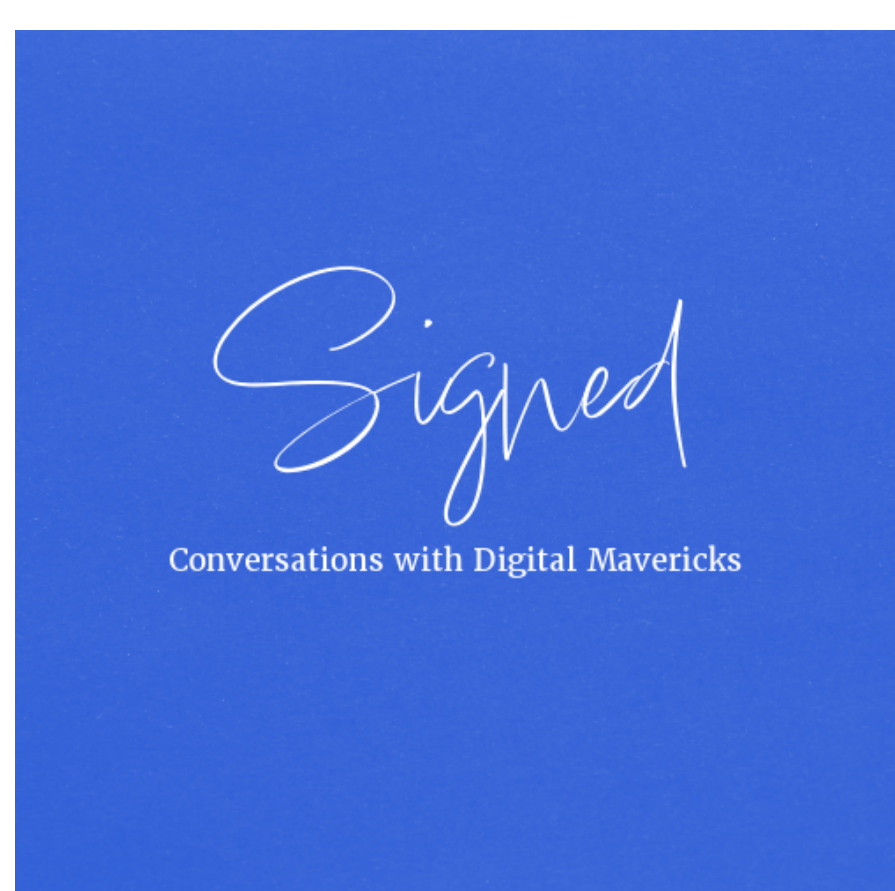

Each month, we will recognize a client whose collaboration and accomplishments exemplify the values of our firm.

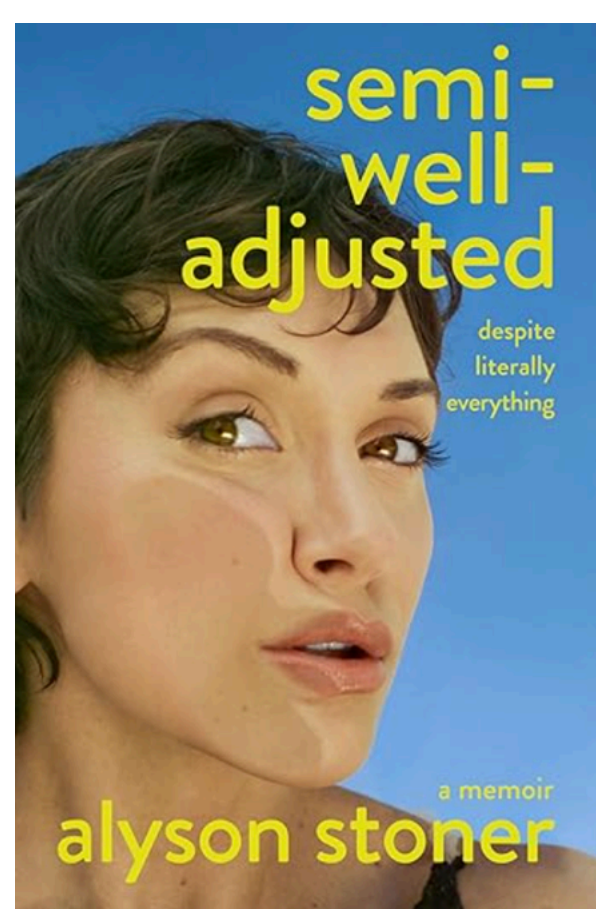
